The cost of school uniforms in Kenya has shown to reduce attendance and enrolment among the children from lower income families. In Kenya, it is legal requirement to have a uniform to attend school. Unfortunately, many families cannot afford to purchase school uniform for their children, which mean their children cannot receive an education. This is why it was so important to provide new school uniform to underprivileged

children- it will help to reduce absenteeism from school and increases children's self esteem and confidence which allows them to feel valued. Since the introduction of Competence Based Curriculum {CBC} early this year, many pupils failed to report back to school due to change of school new uniforms. When they reported back to school with their old school uniform their teachers sent them away. Smart Nakuru gave the first priority to the CBC pupils by providing them with free uniforms, before the distribution of the uniforms the children were at home, as this made most of the CBC pupils feel inferior besides getting bullied by their peers; as a result the self esteem and self-worthiness were gutted as some may end up dropping out of school. The new Curriculum (grade seven) started in February 2023 and the learners were required to wear different color of uniform of type of uniform to differentiate them from the Primary School. Please note, the Junior secondary or grade 7 is in the same school. (Please see more attached pictures)
